

Fire Home Safety Checklist

Make sure you're aware of the below points to ensure you and your family's safety in the event of a fire

Check your Smoke Alarms

Most smoke alarms have a life span of 8-10 years, but you should check yours is working once a month by pressing the test button

Should yours not sound, or is damaged or faulty in any way please report this to enquiries@clwydalyn.co.uk or 0800 970 72 72. **DO NOT REMOVE OR TAMPER WITH YOUR SMOKE ALARM**



Make sure your Gas Servicing and Electrical Testing is in date

Gas Servicing is carried out once every 10 months and Electrical Testing is carried out once every 5 years. Allowing engineers access to your home will highlight any dangers and allow us to rectify them before they cause fire. Be aware of Fire Prevention



Never leave a naked flame unattended. Make sure all cooking appliances are turned off when not in use. Be careful not to overload electrical plug sockets. Pay attention to Product Recalls and stop using any items listed as dangerous

Make sure you have a clear escape route

In the event of a fire you should get out and call 999. Find the quickest and safest way out of your property. Make sure you know which doors and windows are safe to leave from. Have two escape routes planned in case one becomes blocked

Feel doors with the back of your hand before opening them. If they are hot leave them closed and find an alternative way out



Fire Home Safety Checklist

Make sure you're aware of the below points to ensure you and your family's safety in the event of a fire



Keep keys near to doors/windows so you can find them quickly in an emergency

If you are trapped and cannot leave the room, place towels, rags or clothing around door frames to prevent the entrance of smoke. Phone 999 and tell them which room you are trapped in or open windows and yell for help

NEVER re-enter the building once you have left



Practice Fire Drills with children and household members

Learn the best escape routes by having practice Fire Drills with all members of the house. Make sure everyone knows how to open doors, latches, and locks if they need to escape. Make sure you have a safe way of exiting the property from upper floors, so you know the route out if the stairs are blocked

If there are members of the house who have mobility issues make sure someone is responsible for helping them out in a fire
